

HEADACHE & MIGRAINE





Many people believe that migraines are severe headaches, however headaches are considered a symptom of a migraine. Headaches can cause pain in the forehead temples, and neck. Both their causes and severities can vary.

Migraine attacks are divided into two categories: with or without aura.

- Migraines without aura-symptoms can include nausea, muscle aches, and sensitivity to light and/or sound
- Migraine with aura-an aura is the sensation a person feels 10-30 minutes before a migraine attack. These symptoms include:
 - Seeing flashing lights or lines

 - Tingling or numbriess Feeling less mentally alert
 - Unusual sense of smell, taste, or touch
